

PUBLIC RELEASE VIEW

Small by design. Patient-controlled by default.

A plain-language view of BastCare's system context, visit lifecycle, sharing controls, account deletion, and retained audit evidence.

01

Temporary transcript

Audio stays on the iPhone. Masked transcript text is sent securely to create the summary; Bast does not save or log transcript text.

02

Explicit sharing

The patient chooses each summary and each CareTeam. Only confirmed members receive it. Sharing nothing is valid, and access can be revoked.

03

Evidence, not content

Limited audit and usage records support deletion evidence and billing transparency. They do not contain audio or transcript text.

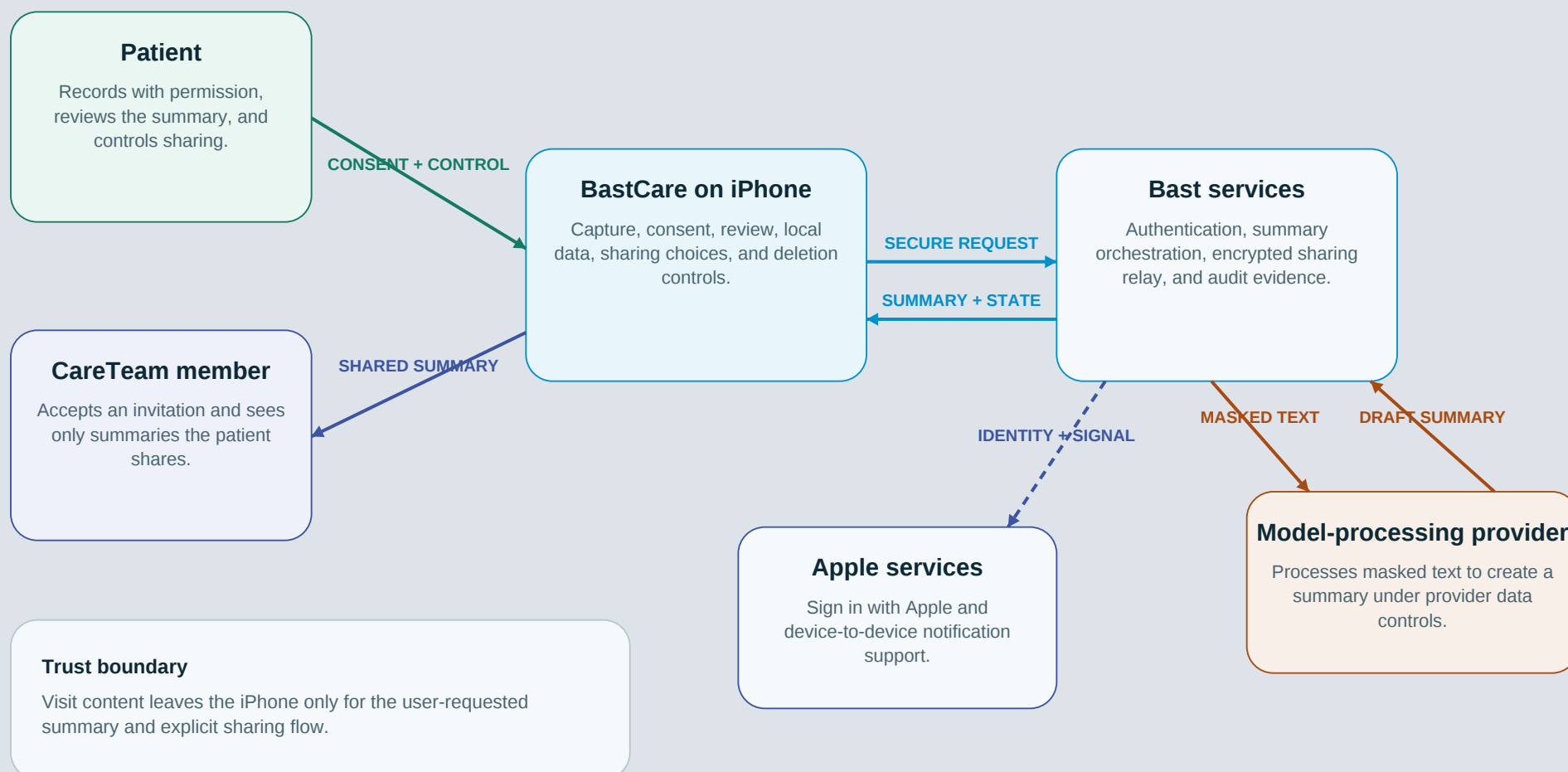
The design promise

BastCare helps a patient capture a visit, receive a plain-language summary, and choose whether to share it with trusted people. The summary is the durable record. The patient remains in control.

SYSTEM CONTEXT

Who participates — and where data crosses a boundary

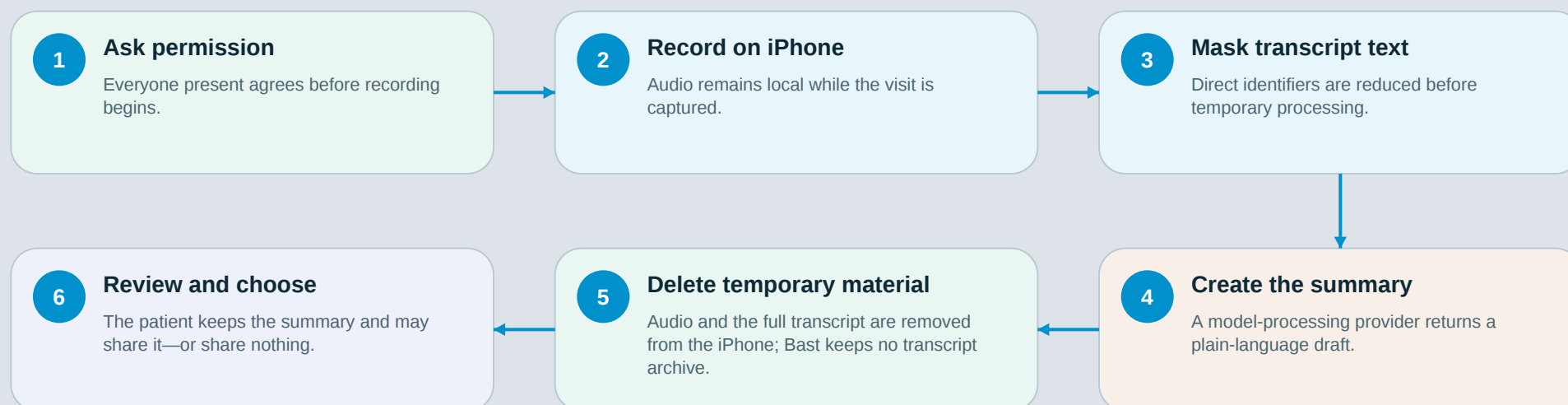
Arrows show purposeful exchanges. They do not imply that every component stores the data it handles.



VISIT LIFECYCLE

From permission to a useful summary

The lifecycle is intentionally short. Temporary material is removed when its job is done.



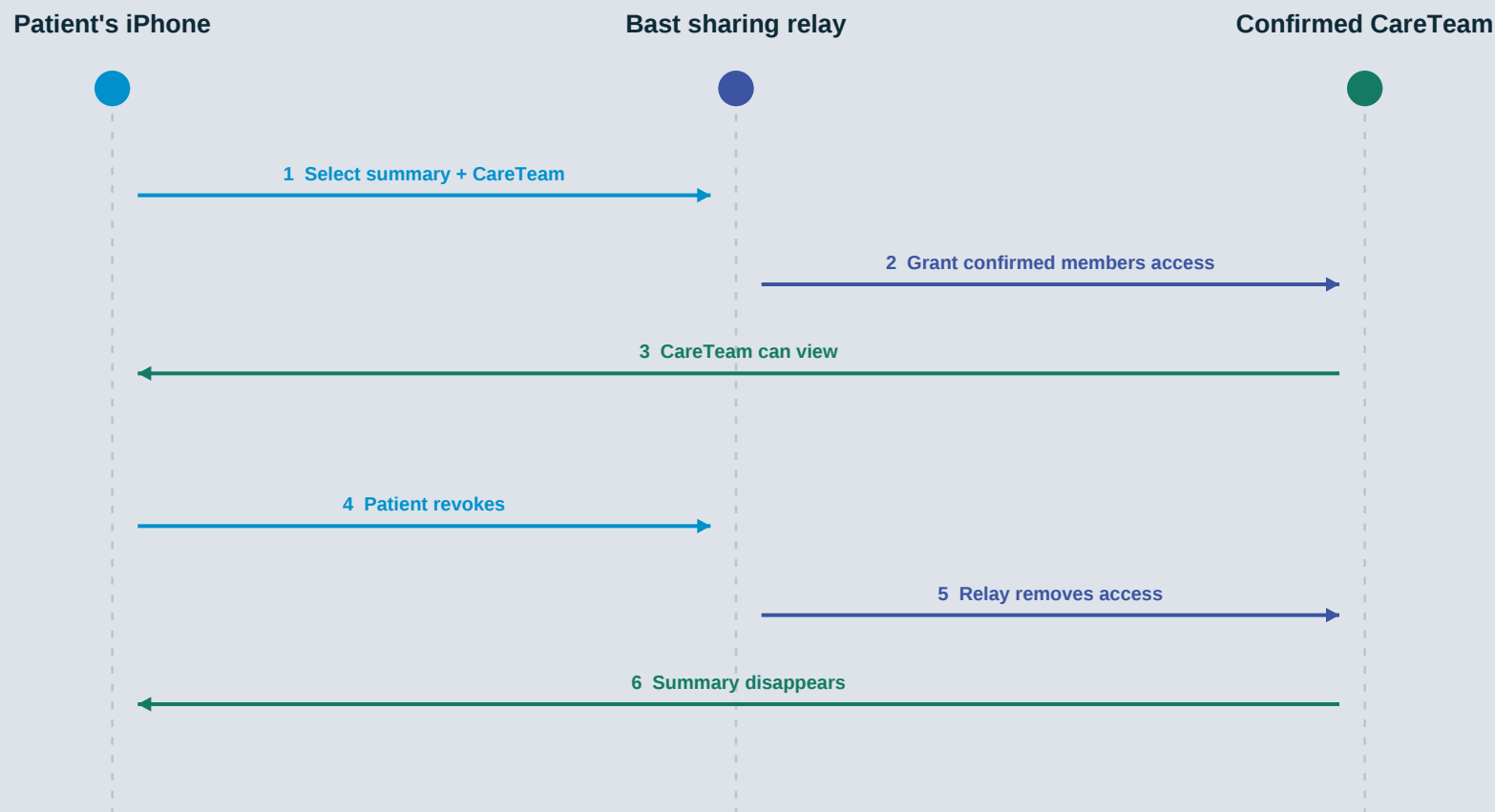
What remains

The visit summary, its provenance, and the patient's sharing choices. Audio and transcript text do not become a shadow health record.

SHARING AND REVOCATION

One patient choice, one scoped result

Sharing is summary-by-summary and CareTeam-by-CareTeam. Revocation follows the same clear path.

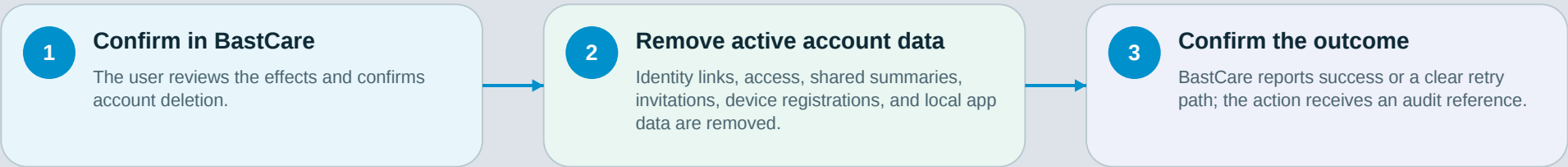


Control rule No blanket access. No automatic resharing. No penalty for sharing nothing.

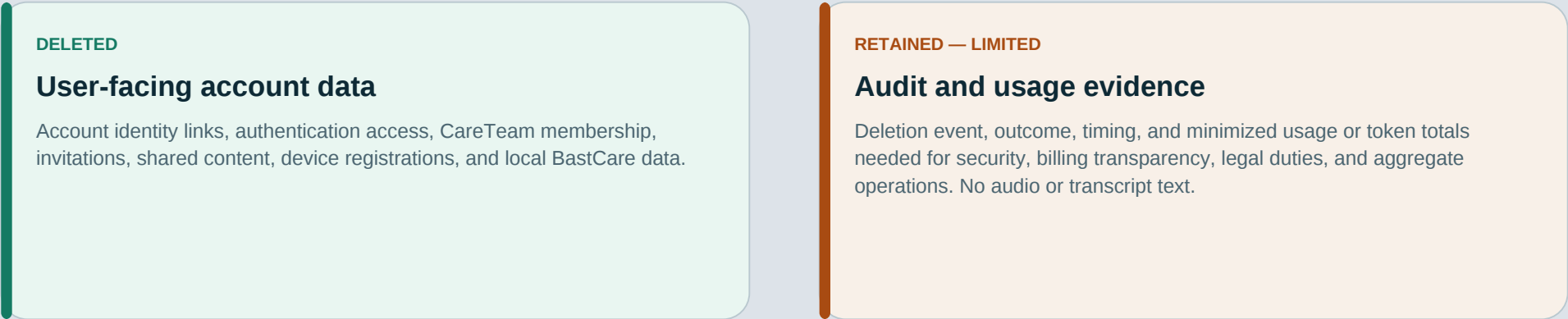
ACCOUNT DELETION

Delete the account; preserve accountable evidence

The flow separates user data removal from the minimum records Bast needs to prove what happened.



After deletion



Retention is purpose-limited, access-controlled, and governed by Bast's documented retention schedule.

DESIGN COMMITMENTS

What the architecture is designed to protect

A release-ready summary for users, reviewers, partners, and future contributors.

C1

Consent

Recording begins only after permission from everyone present.

C2

Provenance

The summary identifies what came from the visit and what the patient added.

C3

Data minimization

Bast stores no audio or transcript archive; durable data serves a stated purpose.

C4

Patient control

Each CareTeam share is explicit, scoped, visible, and revocable.

C5

Account deletion

The app offers deletion without requiring support intervention.

C6

Accountability

Limited audit evidence records actions without retaining transcript content.

Plain-language architecture

BastCare records only with permission. Audio stays on the iPhone. Masked text is sent securely to create a summary; Bast does not save or log transcript text. The patient reviews the summary and decides who may see it. Access can be removed. Deleting an account removes active identity and sharing data while Bast keeps only limited evidence needed for accountability.
